
Preliminary Finals – The Ultimate Crunch Games
It is often said that Preliminary Finals are the most tense and fiercely fought games of the amateur football calendar. The stakes are arguably higher than a Grand Final, given that the winner is rewarded with promotion and the loser faces another hard, twelve month slog to push themselves up the grades. Just ask Old Ivanhoe, who last season were forced into extra time in their preliminary final clash (with the extra minutes conducted in virtual darkness) only to fall short and face another year in B Section. North Old Boys came similarly close several years ago against Mazenod and are now in C Section.

The C Section game between Old Paradians and Beaumaris today is the perfect case in point; two sides that have quite legitimate claims as B Section clubs and who appear very evenly matched. The Old Paradians, with their ex AFL star Daniel Harford, All Australian centre half back David Boudry and the freakish talent of forward Glenn Porteous, pitted against the experienced and passionate Beaumaris side. Significantly, both suffered the indignity of being relegated from B Section last year. Suffice to say, the stakes could not be higher at Trevor Barker Oval today.

Likewise, the **D Section** game between district clubs Ormond and Prahran at Box Hill is the most important in each club's recent history. Though Ormond finished 4 games and 66% higher on the ladder, the Two Blues still look capable of pulling off a huge upset and progressing to C Section. Still, the proud Ormond club has set their sights infinitely higher than D Section and nothing short of a win and subsequent promotion will satisfy them today. Both sides have stars aplenty: Ormond's tough half back and captain Simon Keleher, prolific goal-kicker David Beckett and silky smooth midfielder Leigh Deledio up against senior state rep and competition B&F favourite

Gerard Bevan, last year's MVP and leading goal-kicker Adam Sleight and hard nosed, 300 game veteran Andre Pitts. It promises to be district football at its best.

D2 sees two sides that couldn't be further apart geographically (Peninsula OB & Ruperstwood) meet half way at Central Reserve Glen Waverley. Rupertswood, who went down to the very impressive Old Geelong in the 2nd Semi, are the obvious favourites to climb two grades in as many years but face a major obstacle in the form of Peninsula full forward Shaun Payze, who last week became the first goal-kicking centurion with a ten



goal haul. Rupertswood are looking to emulate another newcomer in Fitzroy Reds in a bold bid to work their way up the grades.

Having led almost all day against Werribee in the 2nd Semi, St John's will still be smarting and will throw everything at West Brunswick in the D3 play off. Still, St John's fell agonizingly short of promotion last year and West Brunswick will give themselves a genuine chance in the crunch game at the Preston City Oval.

Similarly, D4 side Bulleen Cobras will go in as hot favourites against St Mary's at Cheltenham but as history keeps proving; preliminary finals have a habit of throwing up curious results (and always seem to go right down to the wire).

There is no more devastated amateur footballer than he who has missed out on both a Grand Final berth and promotion at the same time. On this most important of weekends, here's hoping that it's your team who bring home the chocolates!



They do it every year, those pesky **OMs!** Every year, the upset win which ensures their immediate safety in A Section and stuffs the rest of the competition up completely. This year, it was **Old Scotch**, their fiercest rival, in a game which meant so much to the Cardinals. Simply unbelievable, that's all I can say.

Paterson (still celebrating his well deserved win in the Sheik Medal), Gleeson (hitting his straps at the right time), Matt Torney (who had a good year for Geelong in the VFL and is back with the Blues playing as well as ever) and Liam Ryan (a bit more low key but arguably the best of the lot) absolutely demolished the enigmatic **Xavs**. They look every bit as polished as last season.

In the dead rubber, **St Kevin's** saw off **Marcellin** to end Robin Bowles' career in style. SKOBs played over 50 players this year, about half of whom were kids, so like Collegians, they should be a real B Section powerhouse next season.





FINALS FOOTY – USING THE WIND TO EFFECT

In 1984 I was assistant coach to Gerard Sholly at Old Xavs. I was also training for the Hawaiian Ironman in October of that year. Fortunately for my training Old Xavs missed the finals (they weren't automatic finalists in those days) and I spent September negotiating the wind along Beach Rd. My experience there held me in good stead for a September at Elsternwick Park.

I found that you get the northerly about 2-3 times a week and when it blows it is very strong, the southerly a couple of times not as severe and if you are lucky a still day.

Any team playing finals needs to have a plan in place for the:

- (1) Northerly winds
- (2) Southerly winds
- (3) Still conditions

At Old Xavs there is a three-page document on playing in the wind.

Without going into all of it these are some of the points.

Both winds push the ball to the outer side at Elsternwick Park. This means there is an attacking side and a "death valley".

Against the wind

Do you send a loose player into defence? (We usually did)

Always have a designated player to do this. He was smart, courageous, a marking player with good disposal, (courageous because he needs to get into the hole).

What do you do if the opposition send one of their back men down? (Usually would send another down).

Always turn to the defensive side (death valley)

Boundary line is our friend. Slow the game, run the clock, (Force ball ups, boundary throw ins).

Be patient – but when you get a chance to break, carry the footy/ use your legs

Try to score goals

Your forward line set up is important, need quick, agile players around a marking target.

Forwards push to the ball carrier (emphasis on carrying the ball)

Kick into space – over leading forwards head if necessary

Kick ins

- Have a zone set up to stop the ball going their way (need height across the last line of defence)
- Kick short and wide on our kick ins
- (Most important thing) Hands on the footy

With the wind

- Keep on attacking side
- Avoid 'death valley'
- High controlled kicks
- Keep the ball alive
- Knock out of packs
- Force the opposition to get the ball out of packs – sweat on them
- Don't dive on packs
- Be careful not to swich the ball coming out of the backline all the time when there are options down the middle. (Because we mostly train to switch the ball, players can automatically go wide when long down the middle is more effective).

On their kick in's and boundary throw ins have boundary line covered

Kick out in front of forwards (don't bomb)

Lots of crumbs as ball skims over hands

Need height in Goal Square

Have a designated kick in

Set up a zone to tempt then to kick to the attacking side, chase from behind, hands on the footy

As there is a lot of information to digest. This information needs to be fed in during the week/ weeks leading up.

Then on match day it is only a matter of fine-tuning. That's after you have had your ride down beach road to check the wind.

5 YEARS AGO - 2000

St Bernards had the better of the **Xavs**, 19.10 to 15.12 and was the 'super run' of the mighty Xavs over? They would have to overcome their fierce rivals SKOBS in the following week's preliminary final to have the opportunity to record an unprecedented 6 consecutive A Section flags.

North Old Boys 17.14 defeated **De La Salle** 7.18 in the B Section first semi. Best players; Booth, Drum, Lock, R Maguire, Sanders, and Curry (NOBS) and Swift, Evans, Mannix, Vavello, Thomas and Goodier (DLS).

Old Brighton did nothing to lessen their overwhelming favouritism in B Section with a 17.12 to 12.13 win over **Mazenod**. Brighton had taken their foot off the pedal a little bit in the final term but it was an impressive performance. Best for Brighton; Bradley (8), Lennox, Dennis, Jackson, Ewart, Williams. For Mazenod; Ryan, O'Donoghue, M Murray, Kavanagh (3), Tucker and McIntyre (Mazenod).

The popular and respected **Mark Gibson** took out the initial "Umpire of the Year" award, assessed on a number of criteria. "Gibbo" remains a highly regarded "Man in White" and continues to maintain his exceptional standards.

D2 Section scribe, Eivion Bowen, summed up the preliminary final result thus; **Uni Blacks** advanced to the Grand Final in convincing fashion over **Parkside**. They set up the win early in proceedings by establishing a five goal lead which Parkside was unable to bridge. 18.23 to 11.10 was the final result. 10 YEARS AGO - 1995

Uni Blues had no trouble defeating **Old Scotch** in the A Section first semi-final, 18.12 to 8.13 and could easily pose a problem to the other contenders, Old Xaverians and Ormond. Best; Henderson, Allardice, McLachlan, Wilson, Lennon (7) and Hazeldine (Uni Blues) and Fuller, McCall, Price, Hosking, Millar and Stokes (Scotch).

After their second semi-final win over **Ormond**, 14.15 to 6.8, **Old Xaverians** were un-backable to win the A Section premiership. Blood, Sassi, Bowen, McDonald, Hunter and Dunn were excellent performers for the Xavs and Dan Richardson kicked 4 goals. Sebo, Grace, McDonald, James, Gallagher and Gilmore were triers for Ormond.

The C Section preliminary final was won by **Ivanhoe** at **Marcellin's** expense, 18.20 to 8.10 and the 'Hoes were now keen to have the rematch against Old Ivanhoe. Bullen, Tucker, Nibaldi (4), Blackwood, La Rosa and Pearce were Ivanhoe's best. Seabury, Theiz, Getson, Sampimon, Moran and Day played respectably for Marcellin.

North Old Boys under 19's were on fire in the Junior Section 2 preliminary final against **Old Carey**. Bangit and Sweeney were outstanding for NOBS and Maguire completely blanketed Carey's gun forward Spencer. Clancy and Petinis each bagged 4 goals for NOBS while Birkhill and Porter each got 3 for Carey whose other better players were Hendricks and the two Angus boys, Matt and Chris.

At the **VFA's Gala Vote Count** many of the big names of amateur football featured in the

medal presentations. Christian Davidson (Collegians) and Matt McConvill (Ormond), both brilliant exponents of our game, shared the A Section best and fairest award. Andrew Pryor was a high scoring, worthy winner in B Section from Matty Armstrong, the diminutive Old Haileybury speedster. Adam Thompson (St Bedes Mentone) won C Section from the brilliant youngster Trent Collins (Marcellin). Thomastown's Tony Fellows won another competition best & fairest (D Section) and became one of the competition's most decorated players; Caulfield Grammarians' star Nigel Brohier was runner-up.

20 YEARS AGO - 1985

Brian (Benny) Goodman and **Peter Wiseman** were the field umpires in the A Section first semi-final at Elsternwick Park between **North Old Boys** and **De La Salle**. It was a special day for Benny in his 300th game as a field umpire and followed a playing career with Brunswick Amateurs (106 games) and I well recall Benny wearing the red and white striped jumper at umpire training sessions! This was also Benny's 21st season in amateur football, a marvellous effort (and still involved 20 years on). The game was won by De La Salle, 11.17 to 5.7 and De La could not be considered as "without a chance" in the coming weeks.

In the second semi **Ormond** easily accounted for **Collegians** by 43 points. Ormond had started slowly but their 8 goal second term set up the win and the final score was 17.13 to 10.12.

Elsternwick's season ended in the E Section preliminary final as **Heatherton** proved too strong, 21.13 to 13.10. Best; T Howell, Ulbrick, Patterson (7), Rooney, M Easey and Quanchi (Heatherton) and Farrelly, Evangelista, Farrington (4), Hill, Bean and Thompson (Elsternwick).

30 YEARS AGO - 1975

the Blacks after being 3 goals down at the final break. The final score in this first semi-final was 14.17 to 13.12. Best players; Butera, Carroll, Wigney, Hall (5), Hogan, S Maguire (NOBS) and Moffatt (6), Clarke, Perrett, Kovess, Webster and Dynon (Blacks).



FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Finals eligibility rules are found under Rules 51-55 of the Association.

Below is a brief summary.

Senior - (1st XVIII teams) Any registered player with a permit can play finals (except AFL/VFL players with a permit – see below).

Reserve - (2nd XVIII teams) Players must be registered and must have played at least four (4) reserve grade matches and not more than ten (10) senior matches in the home and away games (first round).

Where both first and second XVIII's are playing on the same day the reserve grade player must only have played two (2) games in either the seniors or reserves to qualify. For clubs with teams drawn in semi finals on different days of the same weekend (ie. 1st semi Saturday, 2nd semi Sunday – read as above teams playing on the same day).

Under-19 teams - Players must be registered and hold a permit. If a player has played an aggregate of more than 5 senior and reserve matches he must have played more than 5 Under-19 matches during the season.

If a player is ineligible due to having played more than 5 senior and reserve matches and does not gain selection in his club's senior team in the first second round match, he is then eligible to play in any subsequent Under 19 final.

Where a team has (2) U19 teams or is involved in hybrid arrangement, the following shall apply.

Where a club has two U19 teams a player must have not played more than 10 matches with the U19 1 side to play in the (2) team.

To represent the hybrid team in the finals the player must have represented the hybrid team in (5) first round matches – not including finals.

Club XVIII teams - Players must be registered and have played in at least four (4) Club XVIII matches (for the team they wish to represent) and not have played in more than a total of eight (8) senior and reserve matches during the first round.

Where a club has two or more Club XVIII teams a player must have not played more than 8 matches with (either of) the higher placed side(s) to play in a lower team's final.

An **AFL or VFL listed** player will be eligible to play in the finals for his:

- a) VAFA club as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th.
- b) Senior VAFA team as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) senior and/or U19 VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th.

A **TAC Under 18** player must have played five (5) VAFA matches for the VAFA team he wishes to represent in the finals. For TAC players there is no requirement to play a certain number of matches after June 30th.

ELSTERNWICK PARK GATES

The **main gate** (Glenhuntly Road) is open **every match day**.

The **rear gate** (off St. Kilda Street) will only be open when there are no matches scheduled for Elsternwick Park No. 2 Oval.

When parking in the area behind the grandstand please park in a manner that would allow cars around you to be able to leave.

Players and officials who do not produce tickets at the gates will be counted and the club invoiced accordingly.

Clubs are issued with an appropriate number of tickets for players and officials.




