The Day of the Districts


When Ormond plummeted three grades in just over half a decade, it was seen as the beginning of the end of the district club in amateur football. Suburban suburbs no longer teemed with young blokes who automatically gravitated from their local junior side to the seniors. Instead, all the momentum appeared to be with the school and university sides, who utilised their top notch facilities and capitalized on the growing trend for recent school-leavers to stick to playing with their old school buddies.

Today, thanks to some shrewd administration, fiercely loyal players and a determination to prove the doomsayers wrong, heralds the return of the district club. Five clubs, Beaumaris, Fitzroy Reds, Ormond, Werribee and Elsternwick, are chasing premierships glory and all are a realistic chance to win. Ormond and Oakleigh also have Under 19 teams engaged in Grand Finals.

Elsternwick have certainly had quite a year, celebrating 100 years of existence with a gala function which attracted over 350 people. Over the years, they have battled ground disputes, possible mergers and low finishes but have also provided two 300 gamers (no other VAFA club can boast this) and the Mahony family, who have completed more than 1300 games between four of them. To cap this off, they finished season 2005 with just 3 losses and a percentage of more than 250 and go into today's Grand Final as a warm favourite.

Beaumaris (C Section) and Werribee (D3) are the perfect examples of clubs who compete with many other local clubs (paying big bucks) yet who have managed to build extremely successful amateur sides. The Sharks compete with a myriad of sides in the Southern Football League and have built their club on the back of a strong junior

program and the loyalty of long-standing senior players such as Murray Pitts and Chris Martin (both of whom could have commanded big dollars in local comps or the VFL but chose to stay with the club they played with as kids). For a club that was



formed 43 years ago at the Beaumaris RSL as a means of providing a footy club for the sons of ex servicemen who had moved into the area, Beauy has come on in leaps and bounds. Similarly, Werribee have overcome geographical difficulties, the lure of money in the Western region and the presence of the local VFL side to become one of the sleeping giants of the amateurs. Last year, they fielded a gun under 19 team, many of whom have stepped up to the rigors of senior football.

Without question however, the district derby between Ormond and Fitzroy Reds will be the highlight of the weekend. If anything, Simon Kelleher is indicative of the resurgence of the Ormond FC. With the club on its knees, he was appointed captain at the tender age of 21 and has lifted the 'Monds back to C Section, picking up a league best and fairest along the way. Meanwhile, it's fitting that in their 50th year, Fitzroy have finally made it to C Section. After evolving from the Uni Reds FC (after a stint in the Melbourne metro League) a decision was made to change the name and represent what is Melbourne's oldest inner city suburb, adopting the Fitzroy theme song, colours and former home ground along the way. Both clubs have large supporter bases and it promises to be amateur football at its very best today at Box Hill.

Best of luck to all teams competing for Grand Finals today.







VAFA FINALS - NO ALCOHOL

At venues where a social club is in operation during the playing of finals, VAFA spectators, officials and players are not to enter these premises for the purposes of consuming alcohol.

Each participating club is to appoint a person who constantly is to "patrol" the crowd looking for instances of people from his club consuming alcohol during the playing of matches (particularly in cars).

This person is to ask persons contravening this VAFA requirement to desist. Clubs will be charged immediately under the VAFA rules of "conduct unbecoming", when instances of alcohol consumption during matches is observed or reported. Clubs must act first.

PREVIEW



The tasks of recruitment, preseason training, off field roles, practice matches and the allocations of on field coaching duties are activated.

Our personal goals, as a coach, may vary depending on objectives and expectations however there is no doubt that coaching a team to a premiership is high on the list of ultimate achievements. Only ten percent of teams, in the VAFA, will achieve the ultimate goal of a premiership.

The season unfolds and all coaches find themselves reassessing their performance and that of the team. We need to realistically set and reset aggressive but achievable goals throughout the season to take steps in continuously improving the team and individual's performances.

In order to maintain the enthusiasm and focus throughout the season we should be promoting the adage of being the best that we

can. This is relevant regardless of the finishing position on the ladder and should apply to everyone at the club.

There will be many times that, as coaches, we will ask the question: **"What's in it for me?"**

- Undisciplined behaviour on and off the field.
- The excuses during preseason for not attending training.
- The lack of numbers mid season (particularly on cold winter nights).
- A severe slump in form.
- Dropping games that should have been won.
- Lack of effort at training.
- Preparation and time put into training and a game that seems to go unnoticed.

These are a few examples that may prompt the question however this question may also be raised by a player, committee person or club volunteer, in fact, anyone putting in time at the club.

We should never lose sight of the main reason why people are involved and that it is the greatest team game in the world and we love it. As the coach we are charged to create the environment that fosters this involvement and the opportunities for all players to feel part of the club. If we are successful in achieving this goal there are many rewards that will follow and if one of them is a premiership all well and good however it may be as simple as being involved with people who equally love the game.







5 YEARS AGO - 2000

40 YEARS AGO – 1965



FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Finals eligibility rules are found under Rules 51-55 of the Association.

Below is a brief summary.

Senior - (1st XVIII teams) Any registered player with a permit can play finals (except AFL/VFL players with a permit – see below).

Reserve - (2nd XVIII teams) Players must be registered and must have played at least four (4) reserve grade matches and not more than ten (10) senior matches in the home and away games (first round).

Where both first and second XVIII's are playing on the same day the reserve grade player must only have played two (2) games in either the seniors or reserves to qualify. For clubs with teams drawn in semi finals on different days of the same weekend (ie. 1st semi Saturday, 2nd semi Sunday – read as above teams playing on the same day).

Under-19 teams - Players must be registered and hold a permit. If a player has played an aggregate of more than 5 senior and reserve matches he must have played more than 5 Under-19 matches during the season.

If a player is ineligible due to having played more than 5 senior and reserve matches and does not gain selection in his club's senior team in the first second round match, he is then eligible to play in any subsequent Under 19 final.

Where a team has (2) U19 teams or is involved in hybrid arrangement, the following shall apply.

Where a club has two U19 teams a player must have not played more than 10 matches with the U19 1 side to play in the (2) team.

To represent the hybrid team in the finals the player must have represented the hybrid team in (5) first round matches – not including finals.

Club XVIII teams - Players must be registered and have played in at least four (4) Club XVIII matches (for the team they wish to represent) and not have played in more than a total of eight (8) senior and reserve matches during the first round.

Where a club has two or more Club XVIII teams a player must have not played more than 8 matches with (either of) the higher placed side(s) to play in a lower team's final.

An **AFL or VFL listed** player will be eligible to play in the finals for his:

- a) VAFA club as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th.
- b) Senior VAFA team as long as he has played a minimum of five (5) senior and/or U19 VAFA matches for the team he wishes to represent in the finals. At least two (2) of these matches must have been played after June 30th.

A **TAC Under 18** player must have played five (5) VAFA matches for the VAFA team he wishes to represent in the finals. For TAC players there is no requirement to play a certain number of matches after June 30th.

ELSTERNWICK PARK GATES

The **main gate** (Glenhuntly Road) is open **every match day**.

The **rear gate** (off St. Kilda Street) will only be open when there are no matches scheduled for Elsternwick Park No. 2 Oval.

When parking in the area behind the grandstand please park in a manner that would allow cars around you to be able to leave.

Players and officials who do not produce tickets at the gates will be counted and the club invoiced accordingly.

Clubs are issued with an appropriate number of tickets for players and officials.




