This weekend, the 2005 VAFA season draws to a close, with the A and B Section Grand Finals at Sportscover Arena,

and the promise of great games on both Saturday and Sunday. Congratulations to those clubs which have already won premierships, and commiserations to those who missed out in 2005.

While I am generally reluctant to mention individual clubs, it is of significance to note the fact that several "district" clubs appear to be on the rise. Beaumaris is back in B Grade, and Fitzroy Reds and Ormond have advanced to C Grade. These clubs have excellent, forward thinking administrations, and we hope that they can continue their progress. Congratulations also to Uni Blacks on winning back-to-back flags. Can they make it three in a row, and achieve a place in A Grade in 2007?

On 27 September, the All Australian Amateur Under 23 team leaves for Ireland, and will play four games of International Rules. There are nine VAFA representatives in the team. We see this as a great innovation for our (and SA and WA amateur players), as it provides a focus and incentive for our younger players to achieve at the highest level. We are hopeful that the Ireland trip will become a regular occurrence.

From the VAFA's point of view, the 2005 season has been a great success. The standard of football in all the grades continues to improve. We have been able to provide two umpires for nearly all our games, with umpire numbers (and therefore umpiring standards) significantly higher. I would thank (and congratulate) Brian Goodman for his efforts in his first year as our Umpire Operations Manager. I would also thank the members of the VAFA Executive, and in particular Chairman Nick Bourke, for their work. As with all our clubs, the Association is dependent upon many people giving of their time and efforts, and I would thank all those who put in the hours week in, week out, "for the love of the game".

I would also thank our hardworking staff for their efforts during the 2005 season. There is no doubt that their dedication to Amateur football has contributed significantly to the successful and enjoyable season that we have had.

To the clubs participating in Grand Finals, and to the umpires who will officiate in them, the best of luck. I have no doubt that we will see great football.

Inside the VAFA



The VAFA season comes to a climax with the A and B section finals this weekend. It has been a challenging and exciting year for me personally and for all the staff at the VAFA.

Personally I have had the opportunity to visit matches throughout all sections and have enjoyed the hospitality of many of the clubs. At all the games that I have attended I have been very impressed by the manner in which the clubs administer the games. I have nothing but praise for all club administrators, players and umpires.

Much of the credit for the smooth running of the competition must go to the General Manager of Football Operations, Brett Connell, who has overseen the competition. It was with mixed feelings that we received Brett's resignation from the VAFA. He has been an incredibly diligent worker for 12 years progressing from administration assistant to his current position. On behalf of the Executive, staff and all the VAFA community, I congratulate Brett on his exceptional work and wish him every success in his new position at the VCFL.

One of the key responsibilities of the VAFA is to supply proficient umpires to all sections. We are very proud of the fact that nearly all VAFA matches were conducted with 2 field umpires and much of this is due to the hard work of operations manager, Brian Goodman. Whilst other competitions are floundering in this department we are getting stronger. I have no doubt that we have the best umpires in community football in Australia. Congratulations to Brian and his team.

Representative football continues to grow and is one enormous point that set us aside from any other Melbourne football competition. The Under 19 North v South match was a great success and George Voyage continued his great run in the A – D4 match against the Southern League. The Under 23's had a great win in WA in very trying conditions and unfortunately, in Nick Bourke's final match as Senior Rep Coach, his team battled valiantly but eventually lost to a talented VCFL.

For the first time an Australian Amateur team will travel to Ireland and play four matches in Dublin, Galway and Cork. In Dublin we are playing against the All Ireland team at the famous Coke Park. In Galway the two matches are against the National University of Ireland and the armed forces at the city's main ground, Pearse Stadium. Many thanks to those clubs and players that supported the \$2 day in July with the money raised subsidising three VAFA players' trip.

One of the more controversial inclusions this year has been the front page editorial by Jonathon Horn. We endeavoured to make that page more interesting to all readers of the Amateur Footballer and not be an administrative page. We are very pleased with the response to Jonathon's articles as many of them are controversial and instill much debate.



Old Xavs - Can it be done?

Unless you're affiliated with the **Old Xaverians**, the name Kevin O'Shaughnessy probably doesn't mean that much to you. He's the guy who guided the Xavier College school side to consecutive premierships dating back to the invention of the wheel. Later, he moved on to an executive role at the Old Xaverians and helped oversee their reign of flags in A Section. As the boys in Red & Black face their stiffest test to date, it's worth considering just what O'Shaughnessy and Old Xavs players in general are capable of. You only have to look at last week's extraordinary win over Haileybury to realise that this is a side you write off at your peril. The majority of their players played under what the Xavs website calls the "sage like guidance of the Yoda of the APS" (O'Shaughnessy) at Xavier and know what it takes to rack up premierships. Ford, Ockleshaw, Woodruff, Lynch, Purss, Beetham and many others went to Xavier and play that brand of football which characterises their school sides, their Old Boys sides and even the blokes who kick onto AFL. Set your game around a dominant ruckman. Flick the ball out to your key runner out the back of the pack. Chuck a couple of guns on a back flank and give them a license to run. Make sure your players get in the gym and are physically bigger than the opposition. Protect your gun on-ballers with blocks. And discipline. Xavier sides are always disciplined. One up one down, punch from behind, don't get sucked in, don't lairise. Simple stuff, but it makes a difference. More than anything, they know how to win finals and prove everyone wrong. In 1996, I played against them when they had won just two from eleven and were staring relegation square in the face. Dom Berry swaggered onto the field looking like Marlon Brando. We thought they were a complete and utter joke.

Two months later, they were premiers. In at least three of their Grand Final wins, they went in as underdogs while many of their key finals victories have been upsets. Of course, several of the stars of this side didn't go to the school at all. They have picked up three absolute gems from Ballarat: Tim Clarke, Travis Ruyg and Mike Beardsley. Anthony McDonald, who is probably the inform player in the competition at the moment, is himself from the famous breeding ground of St Pats Ballarat and returned to the Xavs after a successful career at Melbourne. Adam Chatfield came via Geelong and Pennant Hills in NSW. Justin Arnold crossed over from the Diamond Valley. Simon Lethlean from Camberwell Grammar. But they all play that familiar brand of football.





team in this grade by some margin, and should go on and do well in the higher grade next season.

Rupertswood continued their upward momentum with another promotion. Unfortunately, it was another defeat in the showpiece occasion of the season (after losing the 2004 D3 Grand Final to Oakleigh), and it will be interesting to see how Rupo handle another step up. However, I think consolidation will be an attainable target at this level for 2006.

At venues where a social club is in operation during the playing of finals, VAFA spectators, officials and players are not to enter these premises for the purposes of consuming alcohol.


Each participating club is to appoint a person who constantly is to "patrol" the crowd looking for instances of people from his club consuming alcohol during the playing of matches (particularly in cars).

5 YEARS AGO - 2000

St Bernards were great in the third term and slammed on 7 goals to 3 to hold a handy lead, 15.3 to 12.8, before the Xavs machine responded magnificently in the final term with 10 goals to run out easy winners 22.14 to 16.5. Their sixth successive premiership had been achieved, an outstanding performance by the leading VAFA club. 7.2 to Brighton's 2.6 in the first term. Brighton could not bridge the gap in the second term but their third quarter was much better and by the final break only trailed by 2 points. In a ripping final term it was goal for goal for a while but Mazenod held on 17.7 to 14.18. 10 YEARS AGO - 1995

Old Xaverians, searching for their first A Section flag since 1981, ran away from **Uni Blues** in a complete blow-out, 15.11 to 2.5. Uni Blues' meagre score was the lowest A Section grand final score on record. Best players; McDonald, McKay, M Blood, Tuddenham, Dillon, Wood (Xavs) and Wilson, Hutchins, Hazeldine, Meade, Polkinghorne, B Blood (Uni Blues). Michael Blood (Xavs) was the Jock Nelson medallist for "best on ground".

Old Haileybury's great season in B Section culminated in their 9.13 to 6.9 victory over **Mazenod** but the game was not a run-away victory for Haileybury. Constant, light rain throughout the day may have partly created the closeness of the contest with the scores level at three quarter time. Haileybury's class showed out in the last term with their 4.2 to 0.2 securing the J V Deane Cup for only the second time in the club's history. Best players; D Seccull, Rae, Morey, Ralph-Smith, G Phillips, Constable (Haileybury)

and Verbeek, Barker, D Murray, O'Hara, Rodgers, Pickering (Mazenod).

20 YEARS AGO – 1985

In A Section it was an outstanding grand final between two great rivals, **Ormond** and **De La Salle**. After a frenetic first quarter, De La held the upper hand 5.4 to 4.2. De La increased their lead slightly and at half time gave a hint that their experience may again be too much for their opponents and the possibility of a repeat of the 1984 grand final result loomed. Ormond were not to be denied however and kicked 7.5 to 4.2 in the third term and it was all level at the final break. As De La tried to extend their running game on the expanse of Elsternwick Park, Ormond went harder at each contest and eventually wore De La down with a final score of 16.14 to 14.11. Best players: Barnes, McCooke, McAsey, D McDonald, Russell, Gilmore (Ormond) and Cooke, Klarica, Harrington, McHenry, Maher, Green (De La Salle). Leading goal kickers in the match; Singleton and Oaten (3 each) for Ormond and Murphy (4) for De La.

In B Section **Marcellin** were too strong for **Caulfield Grammarians** after Caulfield had led at the first two changes. It was Marcellin's great last quarter (6.2 to 1.4) that decided the premiership and the final score in Marcellin's favour was 13.14 to 8.12. Best players: A Cullinan, P Carafa, Amad, Paatsch, Holmes, Cooper (Marcellin) and Fish, Cooney, Berzins, C Stone, Matthews, Collett (Caulfield). This was to be Marcellin coach Neil Le Lievre's second flag in three seasons as he had coached De La Salle to the 1983 A Section premiership.

30 YEARS AGO – 1975

St Bernards comfortably took out the A Section flag 19.13 to **North Old Boys** 12.10. Apart from the 4 point deficit at the first change, St Bernards were well in control for the greater part of the match and built on their lead after half time to never leave the result in doubt. It had been a thrilling day for the St Bernards' supporters as their reserves triumphed over **Old Trinity** by the narrowest of margins, 11.11 to 11.10.

De La Salle were premiers in B Section 15.17 to **Uni Blues** 9.15 and had come from a goal down at the final break before establishing their clear victory in the last

quarter. This was De La's highest achievement in the VAFA to date and their first senior flag since their success in C Section in 1958. It was certainly the beginning of the establishment of an outstanding record of success in amateur football.

Michael Bates of the **Reservoir Old Boys** club won the J N Woodrow trophy for the best player in A Section. Michael had also been an outstanding player for the VAFA at representative level. **John Morgan (Old Scotch)** won the B Section trophy.

40 YEARS AGO – 1965

In their first year as tenants of the St Kilda Cricket Club, the VAFA hosted the A Section Grand Final at the Junction Oval between minor premiers **Uni Blacks** and **Coburg**. Coburg had narrowly won their way into the grand final from fourth place and after the Blacks started strongly, Coburg fought their way back into the game to be only a couple of straight kicks down at half time. They remained in the game at the final break before the Blacks unleashed their full might to run out easy winners in the final term 17.12 to 10.5.


In B Section **Old Scotch** were far too accomplished for **Caulfield Grammarians**, 18.10 to 4.11 and had completely turned around the result of the second semi win by Caulfield.

J (Jock) Nelson (MHSOB) won the J N Woodrow Trophy in A Section and **Geoff Ward (Caulfield Grammarians)** won the B Section trophy.

50 YEARS AGO – 1955

The **Old Melburnians** made it three A Section flags in a row when they defeated the favourites, **Ormond**, at Warringal Park, 11.18 to 6.12. The OM's had won a close contest in the semi final, won the preliminary final in the dying seconds but had been at their very best in the grand final. A highlight of the A Section finals' program was the playing of the Juniors as curtain raisers with Ivanhoe winning their Junior second flag in three seasons.

Coburg won B Section from **Old Scotch**, 10.12 to 8.2. Coburg were undefeated for the season and thoroughly deserved their trophy and promotion to A Section for the ensuing season.


