## VAFA FESTIVAL OF FINALS FOOTBALL

The finals commenced for all the D Sections and Under 19's (excluding Premier) last weekend with excellent crowds across all venues. Special congratulations to all host clubs who had to endure a rain sodden Thursday and Friday and get all matches on grounds that apart from the centre square were in good condition.

Three teams successful in their respective second semi finals and congratulations to Bulleen Templestowe, Werribee and Williamstown who have gained promotion. These District clubs have worked extremely hard on not only their on field games but their off field relationships with the community.

Bulleen Templestowe ran a very successful family day during the season. They received great support from the Manningham City Council and local business and show they are concerned about their whole community. Williamstown showed great initiative this year when conducting the Umpire Appreciation Day. This received media coverage on all TV networks and as a result raised their profile in the community.

It is vital that the VAFA has a strong presence in the western suburbs and Werribee are the flagship district club. They stand alone in their region and provide a genuine alternative to the professional leagues in their area.

This weekend sees all sections join in the VAFA Festival of Finals Football and what a weekend it will be. Sportscover Arena will host the B and A Section semi finals on Saturday and Sunday respectively. Recently relegated clubs Old Haileybury and Marcellin do battle in this do or die contest.

On Saturday Hampton Rovers take on Ormond. Coincidentally both of these teams played each other in the rivalry round so there will be plenty of vigour in this local derby. On Sunday it will be standing room only in this beautifully fixtured match between Ajax and Oakleigh.

By Sunday night we will know another 5 clubs who will have gained promotion.

### International Cup

The International Cup commenced on Wednesday with 18 countries doing battle. Nick Bourke and I addressed the countries at their conference about opportunities for players in amateur football around the country.

Some of the countries are more developed than others but the VAFA clubs should endeavour to create a relationship with these countries to assist in the development of the game. It could be valuable to have an environment where your players could visit during the off season.

In my dealings with clubs in Ireland, they are extremely keen to look after VAFA players to come to Ireland and play Gaelic football. Their season runs for most of the year and a player could easily be accommodated in our off season. Similar to Australian cricketers going to England to play club cricket.

An outstanding opportunity to immerse in another country's culture, play for the local club and work part time.

These opportunities will grow if Australian Rules Football develops around the world and is expanded so that those playing the game are not just expats looking for a social game on the weekend but locals keen on experiencing this great game.

Thank you also to the VAFA clubs who are hosting the countries and I am sure it will have long term benefits for your clubs.

Camberwell can rejoice in the fact they reinstate their B grade status and that they have two good players for the future in Jack Le Cerf and Johnny Frattin who were outstanding in their debut game up from the Under 19's.

Touted as the game of the season, the battle at Essendon lived right up to its title as St Bernard's took the first round points in a tough and physical encounter on a rather sticky wicket. However like majority of teams experienced this season when playing OEG, that second quarter back up is a tough ask and once again the OEG went into overdrive opening up an 18 point lead at the main break. Treating the match as a final, OEG controlled the game from there on end and dictated throughout to leave the scoreboard two to zero in their favour against their arch rival. Chris Goulet became the catalyst to the OEG surge as he claimed the best afield honours while Trent Skurrie remains unstoppable at the business end of the season kicking six majors. Wingman Tommy Caven was unstoppable for the Doggies being the best and kicking three goals.



**SEMI FINAL REVIEW**

Bulleen Templestowe clinched promotion to C Section with an 18 point win over North Old Boys/St. Patricks College in the D1 Second Semi Final at Central Reserve, Glen Waverley on Saturday. Conditions were pretty good for football, with the ground in good nick, apart from the sticky wicket in the centre square.

The Bullants started the quicker, kicking seven goals to three in the first term, including a run of four straight, with **Dean Matthews** and **Paul Florance** wreaking plenty of havoc in this period, with the ex-St. Kilda man kicking three goals for the quarter, providing what proved to be a decisive break.

The Cobbers had the greater number of attacking opportunities in the early part of the second quarter, and got their due reward through a fine running goal from **Tom O'Halloran**. However, this signalled the start of another burst of goals by the Bullants, three on this occasion with **Matthews** bagging two of these. **Matthew Keown** got the last major to keep the Cobbers in touch, trailing by 27 points at the main break.

It was goal for goal in the first part of the third term, with both sides splitting four goals between them. The greater part of the quarter involved plenty of dour struggle, with few clear cut opportunities for either side.

Bulleen Templestowe goaled through **Florance** and **Dean Tulloch** to give the Bullants what looked like the start of a rampage, but instead it proved to be merely breathing space, as the Cobbers kicked the last four goals of the game to trim the margin to a respectable, if somewhat flattering, 18 points at the final siren.

For the victors, skipper **Al Tehan** and **Mark Pietryk** were creative catalysts in defence and up the middle of the park, while **Paul Bryar's** three goals provided a focal attacking point for the Cobbers.

In the First Semi Final on Sunday, Old Geelong turned it on in the second half, their sharp and crisp football doing the business over Old Mentonians to the tune of 38 points. Conditions were pretty identical to Saturday, albeit perhaps a bit chillier.

**Matt Goldsworthy** got the first goal of the game, getting a second chance having being bought down late after his original shot for goal missed. The Panthers then had several opportunities to score a major, keeping the ball in their forward 45 for a sustained period of time, before **Keith Biggs** broke through, goaling off the ground. Ironically, it took an excursion into Old Geelong forward territory to create this chance. The effervescent **Goldsworthy** scored his second of the term, before **Chad Twentyman** goaled after being given too much room and straightening up after the biggest of U-turns. The Panthers held a slender four point lead at the first change, and the Old Mentonians runner held the record for most metres run in a quarter...does the man have a Kenyan passport?

The Panthers kicked the first two goals of the second quarter, and it looked as if their defensive forward pressure, responsible for a fair portion of their offensive output thus far, was beginning to tell. The Oggers then seized control, **Chris "Zapp" Branigan** and **Goldsworthy** finished off the good work of their upfield compatriots to give them a fifteen point lead at one stage, before the Panthers hit back with two late goals through **Ben Lane** and **Gareth Snow** to go into the main break trailing by three points. Old Mentonians arguably had the greater amount of ball in general play, but Old Geelong looked more efficient whenever they were in possession.

The Oggers put pedal to the metal in the third term, kicking five goals to one, **David Teasdale** getting the

Panthers only major with a massive roost from well outside the arc. **Sam Long**, **Josh Young** and **Goldsworthy** split the goals for Old Geelong as they stretched their lead to 30 points with one quarter left to play.

The final stanza was a low scoring affair, with the Oggers outscoring the Panthers two goals to one to triumph by 38 points. **Matt Goldsworthy** was, ahem, worth his weight in gold with six majors, but it was **Ed Bayles** and **Nic Casbault** who were the real instigators of this victory. **Gareth Snow**, **Dave Cochrane** and **Brad Norton** were key performers for the Panthers.

In the reserves, Old Geelong won their way through to the Grand Final, defeating NOB/SPC by 33 points. The Cobbers will face Old Mentonians, who accounted for Fitzroy Reds in a low scoring affair. In fact, the Reds got their first goal half way through the last quarter, as I was taking my seat for the next game. Perhaps Reds playing coach **Fraser Cameron** saw me, and felt the need to bust a move. **Matthew Elliott**, **Cam Duncan**, **Dale Messina** and **Matt Lumsden** stood out for the Panthers.

**PRELIMINARY FINAL PREVIEW**

Old Geelong played, for mine, the best footy of the weekend, while NOB/SPC were flattered by the latter part of their final term and should not be fooled by the final margin of their match last weekend. On the surface, this promises to be a shootout, with the Oggers ranking first in 'points for' and the Cobbers third (behind Bulleen Templestowe by eight points). However, over the last five weeks, Old Geelong have averaged 101 points per game, compared to NOB/SPC's 84 PPG, which is a pretty accurate reflection of their contrasting fortunes the last few weeks. Indeed, both teams scored pretty close to these figures last week, so the recent form line looks to be reliable, certainly good enough to influence in my tipping. In what will come as a disappointment to Old Geelong supporters, given how they've gone in recent weeks whenever I've picked against them, I will be plumping for the Oggers today.



## • "GAFFED" CROWNED TIPPING CHAMPION



# ... Retrospective

## 5 YEARS AGO - 2003

It was first week of the finals in **A** and **B** Sections with two interesting first semi-finals. In **A** Section, **Old Xaverians** and **St Bernards**, sitting first and second respectively, would appear to be the best two teams but today it was up to either third team, **Old Scotch** or **Old Haileyburians**, fourth, to 'strut their stuff' and become a genuine contender. It was a good start from Scotch who really had their kicking boots on early and they posted 5 straight goals in the first quarter. They didn't have it all their own way however as Haileybury scored 3.1. The big man strength of Haileybury may be the telling point but the **J N Woodrow Medallist** (best player award in **A** Section), **Andrew Crow**, had other ideas and started to make a real impact on the game in the second quarter as Scotch simply blew their opposition away with 7 goals to 1. There was no looking back and Scotch tipped Haileybury out of the finals race with a final score, 19.11 to 9.3. 

# FINALS ELIGIBILITY

Finals eligibility rules are found under Rules 51-55 of the Association.

Below is a brief summary.

**Senior** - (1st XVIII teams) Any registered player with a permit can play finals (except VFL or TAC players with a permit – see below).

**Reserve** - (2nd XVIII teams) Players must be registered and must have played at least four (4) reserve grade matches and not more than ten (10) senior matches in the home and away games (first round).

Where both first and second XVIII's are playing on the same day the reserve grade player must only have played two (2) games in either the seniors or reserves to qualify.

For clubs with teams drawn in semi finals on different days of the same weekend (ie. 1st semi Saturday, 2nd semi Sunday) read as above teams playing on the same day).

**U19** - Players must be registered and hold a permit. If a player has played 6 or more senior and reserve matches he must have played 6 or more Under-19 matches during the season.

Where a Club is represented in a match in the Second Round of the Senior Grade OR Reserve Grade on the same day OR on the same weekend the 6 match provision above shall not apply.

Where a team has (2) U19 teams or is involved in hybrid arrangement, the following shall apply.

- (i) Where a club has two U19 teams, a player must have not played more than 10 matches with the U19 (1) side to play in the (2) team.
- (ii) To represent a hybrid team in the finals the player must have represented the hybrid team in (5) first round matches – not including finals.

- (iii) Under 19 Grade teams obtaining "Top Up" players during First Round matches from another Under 19 Grade team is not considered to be a hybrid team arrangement. "Top Up" players are not permitted in Second Round matches.

**Club XVIII teams** - Players must be registered and have played in at least four (4) Club XVIII matches (for the team they wish to represent) and not have played in more than a total of eight (8) senior and reserve matches during the first round.

Where a club has two or more Club XVIII teams a player must have not played more than 8 matches with the higher placed side to play in the lower team's finals - if teams are in different sections.

*Where both Club XVIII teams are in the same section the following to apply:*

- (i) A player cannot alternate between teams after June 30. Once he plays with a team after June 30 he can only represent that team for the rest of the season.
- (ii) the player is only allowed to play finals for the team they represent after June 30,
- (iii) to be eligible for finals with either side, a player must have played a minimum of 4 matches with the side they wish to represent and
- (iv) the player must have played more games for the side they wish to represent than the other club side in the same section.

**A VFL or TAC Cup listed player** must play a minimum of five (5) VAFA First Round matches (i.e. home and away matches) including two (2) matches after 30th June for the team he wishes to represent in the Second Round. An Under 19 player may combine Senior and Under 19 matches in order to be eligible to play for his Senior Grade team in the Second Round. Players cannot combine matches for Reserves or U19 finals.
